## Strategy: Core Principles

---

1. TRF works for the wider public interest and benefit.
2. TRF believes that the overwhelming majority of trailriders use Green Roads responsibly, sustainably and appropriately.
3. TRF aims to be representative of all responsible trailriders whom we welcome to join us as members
4. TRF's aim is to Conserve Green Roads for the benefit of all responsible and sustainable users.
5. TRF aims to preserve the heritage of Green Roads, in particular the heritage of trailriding.
6. TRF aims to protect trailriding rights that can be exercised appropriately, sustainably and responsibly.
7. TRF aims to share information and educate trailriders and the wider public about the heritage, benefits and qualities of Green Roads and Trailriding, so that the wider public may be able to better enjoy them.
8. TRF aims to promote the safer use and enjoyment of the Green Road network, together with strategic black roads that link them, for the benefit of all forms of traffic, paying particular regard to the needs of Equestrians, Pedestrians, Cyclists and less abled users.
9. TRF will not convey sustainable, responsible and appropriate trailriding as being unsustainable, inappropriate or irresponsible. A mainstream trailriding practice is presumed to be sustainable, appropriate and responsible unless the contrary is proven to the satisfaction of 75% of members present and entitled to vote at a General Meeting of the Fellowship
10. TRF will not advocate the use of trailriding practices that increase danger to any user of highways.
11. TRF recognizes and values the co-dependant relationship between competitive motorcycling and trailriding
12. TRF recognises the importance of, and will pay due regard to, the needs of land management when seeking to meet its aims.
13. In pursuit of its objects, TRF will work in partnership with other organisations, where there is mutual recognition of our respective aims and objects.
